And most importantly we talked about “next time.” Next time is already on the calendar, and these women have already begun to invite others to join us.

As always, I am so thankful for the life that God has given me in Ireland. I feel privileged to be allowed to enter into the lives of the people around me – through baby and toddler groups, Bible Study, Godly Play, and this “experiment” of worship that invites the whole family to participate fully. And I am thankful for you who faithfully pray for me, and these people that I love.

So, our coaching flexed to prepare the leaders to guide their team members through choosing their first village. They led a very good discussion over a couple days, and they chose the village of Ja Taw. They might begin work in this village and gain experience before forming two teams and choosing another community.

- For the village of Ja Taw that our team will be discipling over the next few years: Pray for God's grace, blessing and favor to rest on this village, leading to their transformation. Pray for a powerful, dynamic example

to emerge in this village of what it looks like to "disciple this nation." This village will become a beacon of light paving the way for many more Lahu villages to move into God's Kingdom transformation.
