2020 Leadership Conference

Serving in the Philippines

- All of us and the communities we work with are healthy and as of this writing COVID-19 free.
- We now have transitioned most of our FEAST students to the distance learning program. We will hold a Virtual Graduation for the 4 students who have completed the 2 year Bible and Theology program sometime in May. Our ESL students in Purok Uno are well and the community is COVID-19 free as well.
- We continue to meet through social media, livestreams with worship service broadcast weekly. We have all found ways to reach out to our neighbors. Our unintentional garden has been a source of fresh vegetables to at least 6 families. This has been an important source of nutrition because the government only supplies these families with rice and cans of sardines and other tins of meat, almost no fruit or vegetables.

Please Pray...

- With so much uncertainty about when the quarantines will end here, please pray for our churches and ministries to continue in the presence of the Lord. That we would continue to show God's love in all we do and find more ways to support one another in the church and those in our neighborhoods.
- For the future restart of our ministries here once the quarantines are lifted. We will need to shift to distance learning for FEAST for the foreseeable future as current indications suggest all schools will be closed for face to face classes till August. Please pray for Purok Uno as we wait to talk with the community leaders about how we can help once the lockdown ends. Especially remember Tagnipa our most isolated church and ministry. We have heard no news from them in a month as the team is prevented from visiting and there is no cell phone contact.
- For our boys. Joseph works from home and was planning to move with a promotion, but that is on hold. Chris works in banking and works 5 days a week still. Daniel currently is unemployed, a job he was hired for has cancelled all applications due to the COVID-19 outbreak.

Praise God (Thailand-Lahu)...**

- Because Chiang Rai started social distancing early, they have zero cases in their hospitals currently.
- The month of April (Thailand's New Year) is normally a slower month, so those working in TWF were already slowing down.
- Many of Thailand's hill tribe peoples have gone home to their villages where there is enough food and the forests are also close by to gather food.

Please Pray (Thailand-Lahu)...

- Village chiefs have locked down their villages, not allowing their people back from the big cities like Bangkok without first quarantining themselves for 14 days in the forest or orchards. Pray that the hill tribes keep COVID-19 out and stay healthy.
- For the TWF staff to use technology well, to keep working as they can (from home), and to stay connected and encourage each other and the people they work with.
- For Solomon, Yosapa, Ben, and Ja Bo as they see how they can encourage village leaders in Ja Taw through this time. Ja Taw and Ba Mo are the neighboring communities where they are beginning their D4D work.

Praise God (Rwanda, Burundi, DR Congo (Uvira and Goma)...

- Tertullien is thankful for the opportunity to focus on discipling his children at home during this crisis. His girls (four of his own plus two others staying with them) appreciate learning from many of the D4D lessons.
- For our D4D Rwanda national leaders (Tertullien, Augustin, Gerard and Brad) and for their plan to connect with Rwandan D4D team leaders leading 10 D4D Rwandan projects. They are distance mentoring people in Uvira and Goma, DRC, as well as

leaders in the two Friends Church Yearly Meetings in Burundi, as well as an interdenominational group in Bujumbura, Burundi.

- For his promises in Isaiah 60:1-3, 61:1-3, and 62:1-3! In thanksgiving declare these promises over our D4D leaders their teams, their churches and their communities in Rwanda, Burundi, and DR Congo!
- For the healthy birth of Brad and Chelsea Carpenter's 3rd baby, Ian Dushimiye. Praise God that they were able to return to their home in Musanze before the roads were completely shut down due to travel bans to contain COVID-19.

Please Pray (Rwanda, Burundi, DR Congo (Uvira and Goma)...

- For wisdom for the local governments in Rwanda, Burundi, and Congo as they seek to protect their people from the spread of COVID-19, and also seek to keep their people from dying of starvation. Pray for wisdom on how to get their economies running again.
- For believers to encourage their neighbors through generosity in giving needed food and in giving people hope in these fearful times. Pray that God would meet people's needs for food by multiplying food (widow of Zaphath, five loaves and two fish).
- For the rain to slow down, and for the flooding and landslides to stop in the whole region.
