Samson and Priscilla Retnaraj | Serving in Nepal

Arun and Babli are our CHE trainers who have a unique Children's Ministry in Aurahi of Dhanusa district. After their marriage (which was against their parents' wishes) both invited the ire of their non-believing families and were attending the local church. Babli started to bring the young female children together to recite songs and tell Bible stories to them. The children learned these songs of worship and liked coming together every day to their house. Soon the mothers also accompanied the children, and it became a bigger group. Incidentally Arun and Babli discovered that most of these children were Musahars (a Dalit group). The group grew bigger, and we got involved as we trained Arun and Babli to systematically teach using Children's CHE lessons which aligned with Bible studies and encouraged Bible studies in the families as well.



Almost all Musahars in Nepal live in the rural areas. Musahar are primarily bonded agricultural laborers, but often go without work for as much as eight months in a year. Children work alongside their parents in the fields or as rag-pickers, earning as little as ₹25-30 (\$0.35-0.40) a day. The Musahar literacy rate is three percent overall and falls to an abysmal one percent among women. By some estimates, as many as 85% of some villages of Musahars suffer from malnutrition. With scant access to health centers, preventable diseases such as malaria, TB, gastroenteritis, and kala-azar are prevalent.



A few years down the line, many children from this group and others in the community enrolled in the local government school for a formal school education. Now we have about seven or eight who have graduated from high school and are attending the local 'church' in Arun and Babli's house with their mothers also in attendance. The male members of the family did object initially but soon the changes seen in these girls made everyone happy and wanting to get involved. Last year six of these girls took the bold step of making a public testimony of baptism and were formally led into the family of Christ by Arun as the local church leader. After graduating from high school,



one girl even enrolled in a Bible school nearby for a 12-month Bible training. During this time, accompanied by Babli, she went about evangelizing with 'supervisors' in nearby communities which were majorly Musahar communities. God is bringing about transformation in these communities using these little angels of change.



Please pray for this fellowship as it grows in the future and that the grace of God abounds in this community and enables many of them to come out of human bondages and serve with joy and pride in their hearts as they now serve their newfound master – Jesus.

Praise God...

- For the CHE convention held in Kupantole, Chitwan for all the CHE projects and churches in the district. Members of all the CHE committees, the CHE volunteers, pastors, and elders of four churches, as well as all the CHE Trainers attended and gave everyone a report of activities and shared in a time of praise and fellowship. This was a regional level gathering and we are planning a national level convention in February/ March 2023.
- For the goat ministry in Chitwan wherein goat rearing was taken up by four to five church families. Each of them, led by Ra Maya and Juna, have now given back their first fruits back to their churches and more goats have been given to other families. It is bringing great joy among the families as they share.
- Jamuna (our adult non-formal education teacher from Salyan), who has planted six churches in the difficult hilly terrain of Salyan district, got married in July to Krishna BK, a local pastor. Together they will minister to the spiritual needs of the people of Salyan district by taking turns in traveling to all the churches. They also planted a new church in the community where they live after their marriage.

- For Arun and Babli as they prepare three new girls (Madhu, Radhika, and Amrita) from the Mushar (Dalit) community to take on the leadership of the Children's CHE ministry in their community Baidehi.
- For Parewakot Friends church community in the hills of Chitwan and all the families there. The local CHE ministry is working among them.
- Mudebas church in Chitwan which is up in the hills of Chitwan and reached by walking and crossing a small river, is our youngest CHE community and we are going ahead with CHE training and discipleship. The leader of the church is Dinesh Chepang and elder is Raj Kumar and both of them have had attended a short bible course in Hetauda.
- For Priscilla's mother (Indra) living in Lucknow India. She
 recently had a fall and has injured her spine and has been
 advised to do complete bed rest and physiotherapy. Recovery
 is very slow and extremely painful and is made harder by the
 fact that she lives alone in a second-floor house. Priscilla has
 taken leave to be with her mother along with her elder sister,
 Indra is very strong in her Christian faith and belief having
 come to Christ about 30 years ago from a very orthodox Hindu
 family
- My granddaughter, Zosia Chamczyk, has finished school in Scotland and has come to be in the rural parts of North India for a few months volunteering and helping with a children's home and the local Christian School. She goes back to a course in Edinburgh University after a year. Please pray for her as she adjusts to the difficult situation, she faces with no regular power supply or internet services. She is looking to be a missionary after her university course.

- At the end of July, we were in Nagyszőlős, (Vinogradiv) Ukraine. This is Sylvia's home country, and it has been 47 years since she has been there. Glory to God, she could meet her relatives again. Everybody was so hospitable to us and Sylvie's aunt, Maria, helped us in everything. We could visit many poor families, with our donations. Nagyszőlős is very close to the Hungarian border, so there is peace, but a lot of poverty. We sent packages to the war zones. Our team met with two churches (Evangelical Hungarian Gipsy Church and a Greek Catholic church in Ukraine) and we could give donations through them. We gave a testimony in the evangelical church. We had a blessed time in Ukraine through the doors God opened!
- In the beginning of August, we could organize our Children Days in Tolna and Ozora. In Tolna, there were 50 children (lots of them were from unbeliever families), and we had a blessed time together. Some of them went to the church on Sunday too. In Ozora, it was also a great time in the community house, we could give our donations to the poor gipsy families. In Serbia, we couldn't organize our Children Days, because it was a village festival in Backi Monostor. We will make up for it in September or October.
- In the end of August, our youth group organized a camp. There were 19 young people together for a few days. The topic was the guidance of the Holy Spirit. They had a blessed time. We are thankful for our youths, and we are praying for them.

Please Pray...

- In the beginning of September, there will be a family occasion again, in Budapest, next to our church. The organizers invited us to do handcrafts and cooking. It is a good way to connect with unbeliever families and invite them to our community.
- For Hungary. Everything is very expensive and uncertain here. Lots of Hungarian people can't or have great difficulty making a living and they are depressed. Please pray for peace in Russia and Ukraine too.
- For my nephew's girlfriend, Dora. She has pain in her stomach for some months and the doctors don't know what the problem is. Please pray for her, she visits our EFC Budapest, but she has not received Jesus yet. Maybe, this health problem will bring her closer to God.
