This time of year is always so full! For each of us, the fullness looks different, and it looks different from year to year. Regardless of the events, people, or things that fill this season, it is such a wonderful time of the year to truly find joy in what Jesus did for us, is doing for us, and will do for us! For our family, we will be returning to the United States for deputation right after the Worldwide Gathering in Thailand. It's hard to believe that we have been in Asia long enough for this to be our second deputation. And, while we are looking forward to all the joys of being around family and friends this season, we are also grieving being away from our home in Asia. Despite the chaos of a typical Christmas season in Asia, we love getting to share the true meaning of Christmas with our friends.



Before leaving we had the opportunity to meet with many of our friends either in their houses or ours, and we gave Christmas packages so they would even then have the reminder of Christmas and whom we celebrate. We know that despite us not being there physically, we can rejoice that God has not left our village or valley. He is still working in the hearts of those that we love and those we have yet to meet. God has been faithful to us through our many toils these last (almost) eight years, and he won't stop working because we aren't there right now. We need to trust God's timing for his workings to come. Just like Mary and Joseph had to trust God in every detail of the circumstances leading up to the birth of the Son of God, we must trust God in all the details of our lives, even when things end up looking differently than we expected.

We had to leave Asia early before the Worldwide Gathering because some of our visas expired. So, we have had the opportunity of spending time together as a family in Thailand. And while we would have rather been in Asia, being with friends, and working on establishing our business legally, or in America working on setting up a new home and visiting family, we are trusting God and his details. While in Thailand, M. became quite sick with a bacterial infection called scrub typhus, and we are very thankful that we were able to get answers and medication quickly so that he could have a fast recovery. We have also recently suffered the loss of M.'s grandmother and grieved the loss of her life while being an ocean away. It has reminded us of the importance of a legacy of a life well-lived for Christ. So, in all the fullness of this season, we, too, are striving to faithfully serve and obediently follow Christ in a way that points all those that we encounter to Christ! May your Christmas season be filled with God's goodness and love during this beautiful season!

## From the EFM Office

### *Praise God...*

- For the EFM Board meetings that took place in Wichita, Kansas, during the first week of November. There was a strong sense of unity as well as excitement about what God is doing through the Five-Year Goal (see below) and the activities of the Luke 10 Initiative that are helping us to accomplish it.
- For the International Friends Church Multiplication Conference that took place during the second week of November. Evangelically-minded Friends from across North America and around the world gathered online to view inspirational messages and helpful workshops related to church planting. We also prayed together and met in small groups to discuss what we are learning about how to make disciples and start new churches.

### *Please Pray...*

- For the Worldwide Missionary Gathering that will take place December 2-7 in Chiang Mai, Thailand. Almost 70 people will be gathering there, including most of our missionaries, which represents a lot of traveling! Pray for safe travels, good health, encouraging fellowship, time to rest, and the kind of worship that knits us more closely to God and one another.
- For the evangelistic activities that are taking place in many of the countries where EFM missionaries are working. The Christmas season provides good opportunities to talk about the Savior who was born in Bethlehem and why he came into the world.

## EFM Five-Year Goal:

**To send 10 new missionary households from North America to launch 5 new fields by December 31, 2025.**

### *Praise*

- For all the Luke 10 Initiative activities that have taken place this year. They have included seven Luke 10 Exploration Trips and various opportunities for those we call "future missionaries" to discern how God might be wanting to use them to help fulfill the Great Commission. There have also been the monthly Luke 10:2 Prayer Gatherings on Zoom. It has been a very busy year!
- For the National Luke 10 Think Tank that happened in Wichita right before the EFM Board meetings. Just over 40 leaders, future missionaries, and people with missions experience gathered to worship the Lord, hear reports from the seven Luke 10 Exploration Trips that have occurred so far, and help discern what the next steps might be in the areas explored. It was also a time to celebrate what God is doing in and through us as we pursue his command to take the gospel to the nations.

### *Please Pray...*

- For the Lord of the harvest to send more workers into the harvest fields.
- For the eighth Luke 10 Exploration Trip that will take place in Thailand in December following the Worldwide Missionary Gathering mentioned above. This trip is organized and led by Friends leaders in Evangelical Friends Church-Eastern Region. The trip will help identify what opportunities there are to make disciples and plant churches in various parts of Southeast Asia where the Lahu people are located.
- For the remaining two Luke 10 Exploration Trips that are in the planning stages. One will be to Northern India and the other to Northeast Brazil. They will both probably be completed by March of 2023.

Serving in Ukraine**

***Praise God...***

- We received our new residence documents! An extra note of victory considering all of the hang-ups with daily power outages in Kyiv and everything closing every time there is an air siren warning. Makes for only a few working hours per day for any business or office.
- We have a generator up and operating. Just to keep us going minimally with internet, computers, and a few lights, but gives the possibility of work without interruption!
- Abe has traveled far and wide across the country explaining Centers of Hope and there is a very high interest in it.

***Please Pray...***

- Abe will hold the introductory workshop for Centers of Hope December 8-9 for candidates. Provincial superintendents are also invited, as well as people who are already involved with humanitarian distribution but struggling with actually reaching the hearts of displaced people. (It takes a lot of personal contact—not just including a tract in a package.) It is required that wives also come. Pray for wisdom for Abe as he prepares to lead this.
- That God would move and call people to this ministry. It is based on personal evangelism linked with meeting physical needs (as opposed to street meetings or tract distribution, which is normal here, but with few converts). We need couples who are in love with Jesus, overflowing with joy, and with a burden for the lost. (And willing for the hardships.)
- Continue to pray for God to deliver Ukraine. The winter ahead will be hard as many places have little or no electricity, and some places are without gas for heating. Russia is trying to destroy the infrastructure with the goal of getting Ukraine to compromise and give up their claim to Ukrainian land! People in areas controlled by Russia have no religious freedom. Certainly, this is a spiritual battle only the Lord can win
