Tony and Agi Frei | Serving in Hungary

It is my desire and pleasure to share with you, my experience and thoughts about the EFM Worldwide Missionary Gathering that took place in Chiang Mai, Thailand between December 2-7, 2022.

Originally, I was not going to participate in the Gathering in person due to my battle with long COVID-19, but David (William)'s and Adrian (Halverstadt)'s love and encouragement during an EFC-I Zoom meeting convinced me otherwise. The flight from Hungary to Thailand was 30 hours there and 26 hours back. On the way back, I caught a cold. It made my work in the church over Christmas more difficult, but our Father helped me through it.





The time I spent in Chiang Mai with my brothers, sisters, and fellow workers was like a dream. The beautiful environment was like the entrance hall to Heaven! In fact, my tenyear-old students in the Primary School where I teach watched the video I made while there and one of them asked, "Uncle Tony, is it, Heaven?". This is what Jesus says, "All people will know that you are my followers if you love each other" (John 13:35). I believe that we all felt this Godly love coming from each other. English is not my mother tongue, yet I felt loved and accepted by all present, despite the language barrier.

I am convinced that no online platform or virtual conference can replace in-person interaction and time spent together. I am grateful that I had the opportunity to get to know my brothers and sisters in person. I have received tons of love and encouragement from them.

Our brother, Alan Amavisca's teaching from 1 Samuel Chapter 14 was particularly interesting and valuable for me. It is a seldom preached passage of the Bible. We received a profound message from him, which then we discussed, applied, and internalized in small groups interactively. Special thanks to sister Lisa Halverstadt, who kindly and lovingly helped Sabino, his daughter Clariver, and me, whose first language isn't English, during the small group discussions.



I am grateful to God that this is the church where we started planting churches 25 years ago, in accordance with Romans 15:20-21, which is our scripture of calling. We worked with our brother, Dr. John Williams for 20 years, and it is his love in Christ that I experienced in Chiang Mai from all the EFM and the EFC-I Council leaders. (I should mention everyone by name here really.) Jesus says, *"The one who leads should be like one who serves"* (Luke 22:26). I observed and felt this kind of serving love and humility by all the leaders in the EFM and the EFC-I Council.

On my return, I had a wonderful testimony to share about the Chiang Mai Conference. Numerous photos and videos brought the events to life for my brothers and sisters in Hungary, Serbia, and Croatia. We all feel blessed and grateful that we can build our church in Hungary and Europe as part of EFM. God has given us a real home in this family. We are so thankful for you all.

- For Anita's husband, Christian. He is unemployed now. Please pray for him, that he would be able to find a job to support his nine children.
- For Diana from Ozora. Diana is a young lady with five children who is in a hard situation after her husband left the family. We visited them with donations to help them during all their struggles.

From Abe and Diane Bible Serving in Ukraine

Praise God...

- We both enjoyed very good health in January despite viruses swirling around us. Diane also had a checkup at the eye clinic and her eyes remain stable (from a detached retina two years ago).
- As of this writing it looks like we will be able to continue to rent the house we've lived in for over 20 years. A lot of uncertainty over the past few weeks, but praise God! And in the midst of war, in our micro area, we are not experiencing rotating power outages. Most people in our city have power on for four hours and then off for four hours. Just an extra unexpected gift from God!
- For now, it has boiled down to about 20 couples/families committed to running Centers of Hope. We feel blessed to see the beginning of this vision come together. Already at least 15 people have been saved in January.

Please Pray...

- For wisdom in the ongoing training of leaders for Centers of Hope. Our desire is for the whole ministry to be based on prayer—praying before people go out to contact "people of peace," praying with the people they contact, praying as a primary focus in meetings of various kinds, praying together during training sessions, praying biblically and freshly. The second training session in February will be devoted to prayer—lifting it all up to Jesus.
- Sometimes the mass of hurting and displaced people is overwhelming. Pray that the Centers of Hope will focus on individual contacts as they pass out aid and help people. People need to be "seen" even more than having their physical needs met.
- In the early days we never imagined that Ukraine would be at war for a year. Loss of life, severely wounded, loss of homes, loss of jobs--Even though we are here in Ukraine, it is incomprehensible. And our constant prayer is that the Lord would intervene and bring a stop to this destruction. Incredibly, we are having one of the mildest winters in history. As infrastructure is constantly bombed, this means that in many places people can still have enough heat, soldiers are not suffering as much, and so far, the extended loss of electricity, for perhaps weeks at a time, has not happened. That in itself is a sign that God is at work! No one else controls the weather! (Russia also had the most bitter cold New Year in over 100 years.)

• We had an excellent coaching week in December. When our main leader Yosapa came down with COVID-19 right before our meetings, we wondered what God was up to. It proved providential as his right-hand man, Manat, took responsibility for hosting and facilitating, and did an excellent job. Julie translated for us the last two days directly into Lahu, so we got to hear from D4D leaders Jabo and MaoPa directly about their work in JaTaw and JaSawPa. We finished with a clear plan for the next steps ahead.
