Please pray for each group to successfully finish this process so that they can enter into the "Empowerment" Phase.

 were updated on how God continues to bless our ministry and
 use us for his glory in Nepal. We also got an opportunity to
 visit Arun in the Orthopedic hospital at Birganj and were
 briefed by the doctor and staff attending him.
- For Mudebas church and the community in Chitwan, where Chepangs are a majority and are living in the foothills. It is a joy to witness all the activities which they have initiated after CHE training in the last year and the impact it has had on their growth. The church has invited the whole village to be part of their "Harvest" festival and to join in as they start ginger and turmeric farming as a community this year.
- For Philip Rai and his wife as they moved from Cha'pur (Rautahat) to Bansgadhi (Bardia) about eight months ago, answering God's call to minister to the locals in the community around them. Philip has been financially helped to start a small provision shop and also drives a rickshaw which helps him to meet many people every day and gives him an opportunity to share the gospel.

- For the forthcoming CHE Vision Seminar at Kohalpur on May 7-8, there are fifteen participants from the local church of God including the pastor.
- For Arun, our CHE Trainer, to get well soon. He has a large wound where his forearm and elbow were crushed. We are praying that Arun's right upper limb will heal completely with our faith in God's amazing and miraculous ways. Pray for all the Dalit kids (and their families) in Aurahi, who come together in their village to attend our Children's CHE gatherings. Arun and Babli will be absent from their regular work among these children for a long time because of Arun's accident and hospital stay, and the need for Babli to be with him during these trying days.
- For all our CHE Trainers (and their families), as they travel to various places by different modes, so as to continue the ministry work planned for this month. Travel is very dangerous and full of risks because of bad roads and also bad weather conditions.

- Through the efforts of these Centers, they are averaging one person a day being saved in the last three months! May Heaven rejoice!

Yes, we pray for deliverance and freedom for the occupied areas, but we do praise the Lord for the opportunities it has brought to awaken people spiritually. We have fewer and fewer air sirens in our area of the country. We are also grateful for that but...our peace is in Christ. Nothing can compare to his peace.

- That God would call more men and women to minister in the Centers of Hope. The greatest physical need is in the areas that have been bombed, or continue to be bombed. But, there are hurting people all across the country. They need spiritual awakening. Pray for continued spiritual awakening and workers for that harvest.
- Diane continues to work on trauma counseling materials. God has provided people to walk her through some of it which has been invaluable. Her goal is to have a seminar put together by the end of May, and then, all the materials will have to be translated into Ukrainian, meaning training would begin in September. Pray for this ongoing process and for the pieces to come together. Pray for simplicity so that "ordinary" people can help- ordinary people through the power and wisdom of Jesus Christ.
