The last year was a tough one for me! It began with an aortic valve replacement on January 3rd. (My heart is completely healthy now!) In May I completed an M.A. in Practical Theology at Barclay College. My landlord gave me notice that he intended to sell the house I'd lived in for eight years, and on September 1st I moved into an apartment. In October I had my right knee replaced, and six weeks later (the day after I was cleared to drive) I got COVID-19 for the first time! My body is tired!





There is an old tradition in Ireland, on New Year's Eve, you open the back door to let the old year out, and at midnight, open the front door to let the New Year in. I like the symbolism of this. We have the chance to start again (honestly, we can start again any day, every day). I'm ready to put 2023 behind me and start again. I have been overwhelmed by the care of the people around me, and so grateful.
